CONTEXT CLUE

Use context clues when nearby words tell what an unfamiliar word means. Look for details, examples, or actions in the sentence.

WORD-PART CLUE

Use word-part clues when a prefix, root, or suffix helps explain a word. Break the word into parts you know.

re + read makes reread, which means read again.

PART 1 • SORT

#	ITEM	CATEGORY	WHY
1	The glass was fragile, so Noah carried it carefully.	CONTEXT	The action of carrying it carefully shows that fragile means easily broken.
2	un + happy	WORD PART	The prefix un- means not, so unhappy means not happy.
3	care + less	WORD PART	The suffix -less means without, so careless means without care.
4	After the long hike, Lina was weary and needed to rest.	CONTEXT	Needing to rest after a hike shows that weary means very tired.
5	dis + agree	WORD PART	The prefix dis- can mean not or opposite, so disagree means not agree.
6	The crowd was jubilant after the team won the championship.	CONTEXT	Winning a championship shows that jubilant means very happy.
7	The room was dim, so we turned on a lamp.	CONTEXT	Turning on a lamp shows that dim means not bright.
8	re + usable	WORD PART	The prefix re- means again, and -able means can be, so reusable means able to be used again.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **CONTEXT:** The toddler was drowsy, so he yawned and fell asleep.
- **WORD PART:** A preview is a view before something happens because pre- means before.

Challenge: After losing the map, we retraced our steps and walked the same trail again. The word part is re- in retraced. The context clues are walked the same trail again.

For Part 2, accept any two items if the student identifies relevant clue words for **CONTEXT** or correctly names the helpful prefix or suffix for **WORD PART**. In the challenge, the sentence should include both a meaningful word part and context that supports the meaning.
