HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt aloud and give students time to mark their answers. Explain that a person's name starts with a capital letter, and date words such as October and Tuesday also start with capital letters.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Listen as I read the choices in each row. Circle the spelling that begins with a capital letter in the right place.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	I see Maya, maya, and MAYA. Which spelling shows the person's name Maya with only its first letter capitalized?	Maya
b	I see JUNE, june, and June. Which spelling shows the month June with only its first letter capitalized?	June
c	I see friday, Friday, and FRIDAY. Which spelling shows the day Friday with only its first letter capitalized?	Friday

PART 2 • TRACE WORDS

SAY “The gray words are a name, a month, and a day. Can you trace each gray word, starting at the first letter?”
