5	Our principal, who began her career as a librarian, opened the new media center.	EXTRA	Our principal is already identified. The clause adds background information.
6	The evidence that the prosecutor presented changed the jury's view.	ESSENTIAL	The clause identifies which evidence changed the jury's view.
7	Maya's first novel, which she drafted during college, won a regional award.	EXTRA	Maya's first novel is already identified. The clause adds information about when she drafted it.
8	Cars that block the fire lane will be towed.	ESSENTIAL	The clause identifies which cars will be towed.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **ESSENTIAL:** Players who arrive late must wait until the next quarter to enter.

Challenge: Our track team, which qualified for the meet, will travel to Boston.

For Part 2, students should explain that essential clauses identify a specific noun, while extra-detail clauses add nonessential information and use commas. Accept original Part 3 responses that clearly maintain the meaning and punctuation of each clause type.
