Field Day Track

- ① At field day, Maya began to walk around the track. She moved slowly because the sun was warm. Her friend Leo jogged beside her, taking light, easy steps as he waited for the whistle.
- ② When the whistle blew, Maya started to run. Leo ran faster, but he did not race yet. They wanted to save energy for the last lap, when the finish line would be close.
- ③ On the last lap, both children raced toward the flag. Maya's feet flew, and Leo pumped his arms. They crossed the finish line smiling. Walking, jogging, running, and racing can all mean moving on feet, but they show different speeds.
