Maya's Food Words

- ① On Saturday, Maya helped set up a fruit stand at the park. She bit into a peach. Sweet juice ran down her hand, so she called the peach juicy. A juicy food has lots of liquid inside.
- ② Next, Maya opened a bag of carrots for a rabbit. When she chewed one, it made a loud snap. Maya said the carrot was crunchy. Crunchy foods make a crisp sound when you bite them.
- ③ Maya also packed a soft banana. It did not snap or splash. She pressed it with her spoon, and it squished easily. Maya called the banana soft. Soft foods are easy to press, like cooked noodles.

1	Which food is crunchy? What happens when someone bites it?	The carrot is crunchy. It makes a crisp sound, or loud snap, when someone bites it.
2	Which word describes a food with lots of liquid inside? Name the food in the passage with that word.	Juicy describes a food with lots of liquid inside. The peach is juicy.
3	Which food is soft? Name another soft food from the passage.	The banana is soft. Cooked noodles are another soft food.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

A watermelon slice is juicy because liquid drips down my chin when I bite it.
