A Box of Books

- ① On Saturday, Maya and her grandfather made a small library box for their street. They measured boards, used sandpaper, and painted the door blue. Maya felt pride when the box stood straight on its post. She hoped the little box would bring joy to neighbors who loved stories. Her grandfather said a shared library can build friendship.
- ② Before adding books, Maya wrote a note for the door. It asked each visitor to take one book and leave one book when possible. She wanted fairness, so every reader could find a story. Her grandfather checked the roof for strength because rain can damage paper. They chose a shady spot near the sidewalk, where people could reach the box safely.
- ③ At the first book swap, a child placed a book about space inside the box. An older neighbor chose it and left a book about gardens. Maya watched the exchange with excitement. She knew the box was made of wood and nails, but its real purpose was kindness. By sunset, the new library had given the street a feeling of community.
