Maya's Bean Plants

- ① On Monday, Maya planted bean seeds in damp soil. She placed the pots near a warm window, and she checked the soil each day. Because seeds need water, she kept the soil moist but not soggy. The seeds did not need sunlight to begin germinating. After several days, tiny roots grew from some seeds. Maya smiled when she saw the first green shoots push above the soil.
- ② The next week, more shoots stood above the soil. Maya measured the tallest plant, and she wrote its height in a notebook. When the soil felt dry, she added a small amount of water. Her brother wanted to help. He filled a cup, but Maya asked him to pour slowly. Too much water can leave roots without enough air in the soil.
- ③ Later that month, Maya moved the plants to a sunny place. The leaves needed light to make food, so the plants could grow. Although one plant leaned toward the window, Maya did not turn the pot yet. She wanted to watch its direction for another day. The bean plants were young, but their stems looked strong. Maya planned a chart because she wanted to compare their heights next week.
