A Visit to the Butterfly Garden

- ① On Tuesday, Ms. Lee's class visited the school's butterfly garden. The garden's signs showed which plants give caterpillars food. Each student's notebook had a map of the beds. Maya traced the milkweed patch, while Jordan sketched the zinnias. The children noticed that one monarch's orange wings were brighter than the others' wings in the morning sun.
- ② At the water station, the group's leader read the helpers' list. Sam filled the birds' shallow dish, and Nia checked the bees' water cup. Tiny stones gave insects a safe place to stand. The teacher explained that a bee's body can get wet, so the cup's stones help keep the bees from falling into the water.
- ③ Before leaving, the class measured the plants' heights. Maya's sunflower was tallest, but its stem needed support. Jordan tied the stem to a stake with the gardener's soft twine. Then everyone added notes to the garden journal. The next day's visitors could read the class's observations and use the gardeners' ideas to care for their own plants.
