- ③ Later, the class wrote notes about the trip. Maya wrote, "We are meeting by the blue boat at ten o'clock." Ben wrote, "I will draw the river fish." Before leaving, Mr. Lee asked, "Who's ready for lunch?" The class answered, "We are!" Then they placed their notes in a folder for Mr. Lee to read later.
