A Visit to the Community Garden

- ① On Friday, Ms. Chen's class visits the Riverside Community Garden. Students can carry small trowels to help loosen soil. They must stay on the paths unless an adult invites them into a planting bed. A student may ask the gardener questions about seeds, bees, or compost. The class might see butterflies near the bright zinnia flowers.
- ② Before the visit, each student must bring a filled water bottle and wear closed-toe shoes. They should check the weather because a light jacket may be useful on a cool morning. Students may not pick flowers or vegetables unless the gardener gives permission. They can sketch plants in a notebook, but they must leave every tool in the garden shed after using it.
- ③ At the gate, the gardener explains how visitors can protect living things. Everyone must listen when she describes safe places for walking. If rain begins, the class may move to the covered work table, where students can sort seed packets. A visitor must not feed insects or touch bird nests. These rules help the garden remain a safe home for plants and animals.
