Maya's Museum Visit

- ① On Saturday, Maya visited the city science museum for its space display. Near the door stood a huge silver rocket model. A friendly guide handed Maya a small printed map and showed her a round glass case. Inside, she saw a dusty gray moon rock collected during an Apollo mission. The rock was kept behind a thick clear cover for protection.
- ② At the first table, Maya used a powerful black telescope to study a bright distant image of a star. The guide explained that telescopes gather light from faraway objects. Maya then examined an old wooden tool used by early sky watchers. Its smooth brass wheel helped people measure angles. Beside it rested a tiny blue notebook filled with careful observations from a young astronomer.
- ③ Before leaving, Maya joined a workshop about radio signals. She built a simple cardboard antenna with two long copper wires. Her team tested the antenna beside a narrow white window. When the signal was weak, they added a new plastic base. At home, Maya drew a detailed blue design in her journal and labeled each important part.
