Then Maya tucked basil plants between the lettuce rows. Bees moved among the flowers while she worked nearby that morning. By breakfast time, the pair had watered every bed along the path.
- ③ Later, Maya checked the garden map inside the gate. A blue line showed the route around the pond, where rainwater collected after storms. She noticed a sign beneath an apple tree. It asked visitors to keep their feet on the gravel walk. Maya smiled as she looked across the garden at the busy bees and bright vegetables.
