- ② First, the teams had to pull weeds that crowded the young beans. Maya found two worms under a flat rock. She placed them back in the soil because worms help make spaces for air and water. "There are more weeds by the fence," Luis said. "I can carry this bucket there." Maya smiled. "I want to help, too."
- ③ Before lunch, the class used a chart to list jobs for tomorrow. Two students would bring mulch, and two would fill the birdbath. The birdbath stood near the garden, so birds could drink there on warm days. Maya wrote her name beside the watering job. Luis added his name, too. Their group planned to meet early, but they knew they needed permission to return outside.
