A Turtle's First Journey

- ① At night, a sea turtle hatchling may emerge, or come out, from its sandy nest. It uses its flippers to crawl toward the brighter horizon over the ocean. Lights from houses can confuse hatchlings, making them crawl inland instead. Scientists ask people near beaches to dim outdoor lights during nesting season. This helps hatchlings follow natural light from the sky and water.
- ② Once in the water, a hatchling enters a current, a moving stream of ocean water. Currents can carry young turtles far from shore to areas with floating seaweed. The seaweed forms a nursery, a sheltered place where young animals can find food and cover. Tiny turtles may rest among the seaweed and eat small creatures there.
- ③ Hatchlings face many predators, animals that hunt other animals for food, such as birds, fish, and crabs. Their dark upper shells provide camouflage, coloring that helps an animal blend into its surroundings. A turtle floating near dark seaweed is harder for a fish to spot. After many years, surviving turtles may return to coastal waters as adults.
