Water on the Move

- ① Long ago, engineers built aqueducts to bring water into some cities. The Latin root aqua means "water," and duct means "lead." An aqueduct is a structure that leads water from one place to another. Some aqueducts carried water across valleys on tall stone arches. Others ran underground, where the water stayed cleaner and cooler during summer months.
- ② Today, a water worker may use a portable testing kit beside a stream. The Latin root port means "carry," so portable describes something that can be carried. A worker can transport the kit from site to site. In transport, trans means "across," and port still means "carry." Tests help workers notice dirty water before it reaches homes.
- ③ Water systems also support aquatic animals, such as fish and frogs. Because aqua means "water," aquatic means "related to water." A biologist may inspect a pipe for cracks. The Greek root bio means "life," and the Latin root spect means "look." By understanding these roots, readers can make a sensible guess when they meet an unfamiliar word.
