Maya's Tide Pool Visit

- ① On Saturday, Maya visited a rocky tide pool with her uncle. At low tide, the pool was a small aquarium, holding sea stars, snails, and waving green seaweed. Sunlight flashed on the water like scattered coins. Maya leaned close, but she kept her hands dry. The animals needed a safe home while they waited for the ocean to return.
- ② A purple sea star clung to a wet rock. Its five arms were as still as sleeping sticks, even when a wave splashed nearby. Beside it, a crab hurried under a ledge. The crab was a sideways racer, darting over the sand to hide from a hungry gull. Maya wrote notes in her field journal and watched without touching.
- ③ Before leaving, Maya saw a line of tiny bubbles rise from a crack. The bubbles were little silver balloons, floating toward the bright surface. Farther out, the incoming water was as noisy as a busy cafeteria. It rushed between the rocks and covered the pool. Maya stepped back, knowing the tide pool would soon become part of the wide sea again.

#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	What does the metaphor “a small aquarium” mean in paragraph 1?	The tide pool was a small place that held several kinds of sea animals and plants, like an aquarium.
2	What does “Sunlight flashed on the water like scattered coins” help you picture?	It helps the reader picture many small, bright flashes of light sparkling on the water.
3	Is “The crab was a sideways racer” a simile or a metaphor? What does it mean?	It is a metaphor. It means the crab moved quickly sideways across the sand.
4	What does the simile “as noisy as a busy cafeteria” mean in paragraph 3?	The incoming water was very loud as it rushed between the rocks.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

The forest path was as quiet as a library. The stream was a silver ribbon winding between the trees. These comparisons show that the path was very quiet and the stream looked long, shiny, and curved.

The passage has three similes: “like scattered coins,” “as still as sleeping sticks,” and “as noisy as a busy cafeteria.” It has three metaphors: “a small aquarium,” “a sideways racer,” and “little silver balloons”; accept equivalent explanations supported by the nearby details.
