A Day at the City Garden

- ① On Saturday, Maya joined a group at the city garden. The volunteers began, or started, by clearing a narrow path between the vegetable beds. Soon, they reached a wide open space near the tool shed. Maya carried a heavy bucket, while her friend Luis carried a light basket of seeds. Both jobs helped prepare the garden for planting.
- ② At noon, the garden was noisy with buzzing bees and chatting workers. After lunch, it became quiet as everyone watched a monarch butterfly visit the flowers. The butterfly moved quickly from bloom to bloom, then rested slowly on a sunny stone. Bees and butterflies collect nectar, a sweet liquid that gives them energy for flight.
- ③ Before leaving, Maya checked the soil. It felt dry on top but wet below the surface. She gave the thirsty plants water, but she did not soak them. Too much water can harm roots, while too little can leave a plant wilted. Maya smiled when she saw the garden looking tidy and neat in sunlight.
