A Community Garden Visit

- ① On Saturday morning, Maya visited the community garden with her uncle, Mr. Chen. At the gate, she read a sign: “Please close the gate, protect the seedlings, and carry out trash.” Maya noticed bees moving from flower to flower. “They are busy helpers,” Mr. Chen said. Nearby, a robin pulled a worm from the damp soil.
- ② Later, Maya filled a watering can, a small bucket, and a tray with tools. Before lunch, she and Mr. Chen planted basil seeds in neat rows. He explained, “Basil needs sun, water, and time to grow.” Maya wrote the date, April 12, in her notebook. Then she checked the seed packet twice, because careful gardeners follow directions.
- ③ By afternoon, the garden looked tidy and welcoming. Maya labeled the rows “basil,” “beans,” and “marigolds” so visitors could identify each plant. After they finished, Mr. Chen asked, “What will you remember?” Maya replied, “I will water the seeds gently, watch for sprouts, and close the gate.” Her notes were clear, correct, and ready for the next visit.
