Building a Pollinator Garden

- ① At Maple Grove School, fifth graders planned a small pollinator garden beside the library. They measured the sunny space, drew a map, and chose places for paths. Their goal was to give bees, butterflies, and other pollinators food and shelter. The class learned that pollinators move pollen between flowers, helping many plants make seeds, fruits, and vegetables.
- ② First, teams picked plants that could grow in the local climate. They selected purple coneflowers, black-eyed Susans, and bee balm for sunny spots. For a damp corner, they chose cardinal flowers, swamp milkweed, and blue flag iris. Each team wrote labels with the plant's name, height, and blooming season. Clear labels would help visitors notice changes during spring, summer, and fall.
- ③ On planting day, students carried trowels, gloves, watering cans, and mulch to the garden. One group loosened soil, another placed plants, and a third spread mulch around the stems. Afterward, the class added a shallow dish of water, smooth stones, and a few twigs. These features can give small insects places to drink, rest, and hide. The garden became a useful habitat and an outdoor study space.
