A Visit to the Garden

- ① At the town garden, Maya hurried toward the tool shed. "Hi, Ms. Lee! Can I borrow the hose? Our beans look thirsty." Her cousin Jordan waved from the gate. "Hey, Maya, y'all need help? I brought a bucket." Ms. Lee smiled. "Thank you, Jordan. We can use it for watering beside the tomato beds today."
- ② A few minutes later, Ranger Ortiz arrived to inspect the garden's water tank. He said, "Good afternoon. Please keep the path clear while I check the valve." Maya stood taller and replied, "Certainly, Ranger Ortiz. Jordan and I will move our tools now." Jordan whispered, "Whoa, we better make room." The ranger's careful words helped everyone know what to do safely.
- ③ After the inspection, Ms. Lee asked the children to tell the garden club what had happened. Maya began, "The ranger checked the valve, and we moved our tools." Then she added, "He stated that the path must remain clear for safety." Jordan nodded. "That sounds more official than how we talk at home," he said. Maya agreed, "Different situations call for different ways of speaking."

1	Compare Jordan's greeting at the gate with Ranger Ortiz's opening directions. Which sounds more casual, which sounds more formal, and give one phrase from each.	Jordan's greeting is more casual, such as "Hey, Maya" or "y'all need help?" Ranger Ortiz's directions are more formal, such as "Good afternoon" or "Please keep the path clear."
2	In paragraph 3, which of Maya's two descriptions of the inspection uses a more formal register? Give two clues from her words.	"He stated that the path must remain clear for safety" is more formal. Clues include "stated" and "must remain."
3	How is Maya's reply to Ranger Ortiz different from Jordan's whispered comment? Use wording from both speakers to explain.	Maya uses polite, formal wording, such as "Certainly, Ranger Ortiz." Jordan uses casual wording, such as "Whoa" and "we better make room."
4	What word shows a dialect variety in the passage? What does the word mean?	"Y'all" shows a dialect variety. It means "you all," or more than one person.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

"Hey, _y'all_, pick up the blocks before we go," Nia said to her classmates. "Please _place the blocks in their bins_ before we leave," Nia told her classmates. The first request is casual and uses y'all, while the second sounds formal because it uses more careful words.

Accept answers that correctly compare casual and formal register using evidence from the passage. Accept dialect varieties as valid ways of speaking, not as mistakes, when students explain their meaning or use.
