The Library Sorting Robot

- ① At the city library, a group of sixth graders built a small robot that sorts returned books by color. During the first test, we ourselves placed each book on the robot's tray and watched its sensors. Mina herself checked the labels because a blue sticker could send a book to the wrong bin. The robot rolled slowly at first, then stopped beside the green shelf. Its blinking light showed that it had found the color correctly.
- ② Before the next trial, Mr. Ortiz asked the team to inspect the robot's wheels. The students themselves noticed a thread wrapped around one axle. Rather than waiting for an adult, they carefully removed it with tweezers. Mr. Ortiz did not repair the robot; he only gave safety advice. "You solved the problem yourselves," he said. The team recorded the fix in its design notebook, so future builders could understand why the robot had paused during the trial that day.
- ③ At the library showcase, visitors asked how the robot made choices. I myself explained that its color sensor reads reflected light, while Jordan demonstrated the moving tray. The team members themselves answered questions about mistakes and changes. One visitor praised the students for testing many ideas. "Our robot cannot think like a person," Mina said, "but it follows instructions that we wrote." Afterward, the group shared its plans with a younger robotics club from a nearby school.
