Preparing a Turtle Release

- ① At a coastal rescue center, biologist Mara Ortiz prepares injured sea turtles for release. Before sunrise, she checks each turtle's shell, flippers, and breathing rate. Tucked into a quiet holding tank, the smallest turtle rests beneath a heat lamp. Ortiz records its weight on a chart, using a scale designed for small animals. When the tide reaches the proper level, the team will carry the turtles to the beach. Their careful notes help the center decide whether each animal is ready for the ocean.
- ② Watching from a raised platform, volunteers scan the water for turtles near the shore. A green flag, placed beside the release path, shows visitors where to stand. Because the animals need a clear route, staff members ask the crowd to stay behind a rope. Carrying a bucket of seawater, Ortiz walks beside the smallest turtle. The bucket keeps its skin moist during the short trip. Near the waves, the team lowers the turtle onto wet sand and steps back quietly.
- ③ After the release, Ortiz photographs the turtle from a distance. To avoid disturbing it, she uses a camera with a long lens. The turtle, moving steadily through the foam, soon disappears beyond the first line of waves. While volunteers pack the equipment, a visitor reads the center's display. Written by the science team, the display explains how plastic litter can harm marine animals. At the end of the day, Ortiz sends the notes and photographs to the center's database for future research.
