The Auditorium Closure

- ① At 7:15 a.m., Riverside High's principal sent families a text: “Auditorium closed today. Use the east entrance for the library and counseling office. Evening rehearsal will meet in Room 214.” The message arrived before buses reached campus, after maintenance workers found water dripping from a pipe above the stage. Students with band instruments and drama costumes had planned to use the auditorium after classes. The principal included a link labeled “schedule changes,” but the text itself did not describe repair work or name a reopening date.
- ② By noon, the district website carried a longer notice under “Facilities Update.” It explained that a broken pipe had soaked part of the auditorium ceiling and that a licensed contractor would inspect the area. “Classes continue as scheduled,” the notice stated, “except for activities assigned to the auditorium.” It listed the east entrance, Room 214, the counseling office phone number, and a transportation-information link. The notice ended: “We will post another update by 4:00 p.m. Thursday.” It did not promise a reopening date or predict when repairs would finish.
- ③ Later that afternoon, Maya Chen, editor of the student newspaper, posted this message on the paper’s account: “Auditorium is off limits for now, so rehearsal is in 214. Enter by the library doors, not the main lobby. We’ll share the next update when the district posts it.” Below the post, she added a photo of a paper sign taped near the auditorium in the hallway. Her caption read, “Detour this way.” The post did not include the contractor’s name, the counseling office number, or a full account of the leak.

2	How do the words “licensed contractor” and the scheduled 4:00 p.m. update in paragraph 2 shape the tone of the website notice?	They create a formal, organized, accountable tone by showing a qualified professional and a specific plan for the next update.
3	Compare how paragraphs 2 and 3 discuss future information. What does each version suggest about how certain the writer can be?	Paragraph 2 gives a definite time for the next update, but not a reopening date. Paragraph 3 says it will share news “when the district posts it,” showing that Maya is waiting for the district’s information.
4	Which version would best serve a family that needs logistical help beyond finding rehearsal? Use two details from the passage to support your choice.	Paragraph 2, the district website notice, because it includes the counseling office phone number and a transportation-information link.

Student text: Chemistry meets in Room 118 today. Bring your goggles and enter through the north hall.
