- ② Sam wrote Tin Bot on the cape. Next, he put a music button in the robot. When he pressed it, Tin Bot played a note and lifted a paper hand.
- ③ At the fair, a baby laughed at the robot. Sam saw a happy crowd wave. The robot had a music button inside, so it could move a paper arm and play a tune.
