Beans for the Garden

- ① On Saturday, Mae and her friend Leo went to the school garden. Mae said, "We could pick beans for the soup." Leo looked at the wet leaves and smiled. Their teacher had asked the class to help.
- ② First, the children carried small pails along the path. One bee buzzed near a yellow flower, but it did not sting them. Mae found enough beans for one bowl. Leo said they should wash the beans again.
- ③ After the work, the class sat under a tree. Mrs. Chen gave each child a cup of water. "People will enjoy this garden," she said. Mae knew her family would be proud because they could share the fresh beans.
