Busy Bees at Work

- ① On a warm morning, worker bees leave their hive to search for nectar and pollen. Nectar is a sweet liquid found in many flowers. A bee drinks nectar with its long tongue and stores it in a special stomach. Pollen sticks to the bee's fuzzy body as it visits blossoms. The bee may return to the hive after finding a rich patch of flowers.
- ② Inside the hive, worker bees pass nectar to other workers. The bees move the nectar from mouth to mouth, then place it in wax cells. They fan their wings to help water leave the nectar. When it becomes thicker, it is honey. A worker may refill a cell when more nectar is ready, helping the colony store food for colder days.
- ③ Wind or rain can damage a hive's wax comb. Worker bees inspect the broken area and add fresh wax. Together, they can rebuild the small walls that hold honey and young bees. The hexagon shape of each cell helps the comb use wax well. By caring for the hive, the workers keep food safe and give young bees a place to grow.
