Listening for Bats

- ① At dusk, a small group of people walked through a city park with a wildlife guide. The guide asked everyone to stay quiet because bats were waking in a tall oak tree. She said bats can find insects in the dark with sound. The children thought this was surprising, so they listened closely near the path.
- ② As the sky grew darker, the guide held a small detector that changed bat sounds into clicks people could hear. Soon, clicks came again and again from above the pond. One bat swept low, then turned quickly. Its wings were thin, yet they were strong enough to help it fly and catch tiny moths at night.
- ③ Before leaving, the guide counted two bats circling near the tree. She was sure there were more hidden in the branches, but no one could see them. The group learned that bats can find food without coming close to people. Many bats eat night-flying insects, and this can help gardens. Each child went home with a new thought about the park after dark.
