A Sea Turtle Journey

- ① Each summer, female sea turtles return to sandy beaches. They dig nests above the high-tide line and lay round, leathery eggs. After about two months, tiny hatchlings break free from their shells. Most hatchlings move toward the brighter horizon over the ocean. This nighttime movement helps them avoid some daytime predators, including shorebirds and crabs.
- ② Inside a nest, warmth affects egg development. In many sea turtle species, warmer nests usually produce more females, while cooler nests usually produce more males. Researchers collect information about nest temperatures and hatching success. This information guides protection plans for beaches where lights, trash, or construction can confuse hatchlings as they crawl toward the water.
- ③ People can support turtles by keeping beaches dark and clean during nesting season. A reusable water bottle and a trash bag can reduce harmful litter. On some beaches, volunteers place harmless barriers around marked nests to keep vehicles away. These small actions give hatchlings a safer path from the sand to the sea at night each year.
