- ② "Hold tight!" called her little brother, Eli, from the path. Maya nodded, yet another strong gust pulled the kite toward a low branch. For one breath, the paper triangle shook. Would it tear? Maya ran three quick steps, lifted the string high, and felt the pull grow smooth again. "It's safe," she said, her voice calm but proud.
- ③ At the top of the hill, the wind softened. The kite floated in wide, quiet circles, and Maya let out a slow breath. Eli climbed beside her and pointed toward the blue sky. "Look at that!" he cried. A hawk glided far above the kite. Maya watched both shapes turn together. "We can fly it a little longer," she said.
