FACT

A fact can be checked in a reliable source, record, or object. It states what happened or what exists without deciding whether it was good, important, or best.

A 1912 newspaper printed the election results.

REASONED JUDGMENT

A reasoned judgment gives a conclusion supported by a reason or evidence. It often decides whether something was wise, fair, effective, or important.

Because the evacuation plan moved families away from the flood zone quickly, it was an effective response.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **FACT:** A ship's log recorded rain on October 6.
- **JUDGMENT:** Because the new trail signs prevented hikers from getting lost, the park made a wise improvement.

Challenge: The school board should keep the archive open on Saturdays because visitor logs show that 64 people used it on each of the past two Saturdays, and a questionnaire found that 31 local residents asked for weekend access.

Accept FACT when the statement can be verified without evaluating it. Accept JUDGMENT when the statement reaches a conclusion about quality, fairness, importance, or effectiveness and supports that conclusion with a reason.
