YOUR JOB Number the steps Maya takes in order. Circle the changes that happen to the seed or plant so you can see how the steps and changes connect.

Maya Grows a Bean

- ① To grow a bean plant, Maya first dampened a paper towel. She put a bean seed inside the towel and placed it in a clear plastic bag. Then she taped the bag near a sunny window.
- ② Each day, Maya checked the towel. When it started to feel dry, she added a few drops of water. The damp towel helped the seed take in water. Soon, the seed coat split open.
- ③ After the coat split, a tiny root grew down. A small shoot grew up toward the light. When the shoot had leaves, Maya moved the young plant into soil. The roots could then get water from the soil.

#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	How did adding water to the dry towel connect to the seed coat splitting open?	Adding water kept the towel damp, which helped the seed take in water. Then the seed coat split open.
2	What two changes happened after the seed coat split? Tell which way each part grew.	A tiny root grew down, and a small shoot grew up toward the light.
3	Why did Maya move the young plant into soil after it had leaves?	She moved it into soil so the roots could get water from the soil.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Box 1: The seed coat split open. Box 2: A root grew down and a shoot grew up. Box 3: Maya moved the plant into soil. The split coat led to new parts growing, and the plant was then ready to move into soil.
