How Beaver Dams Change a Stream

- ① Beavers are known for building dams across small streams. A dam is a wall of branches, mud, and stones that slows moving water. Behind the dam, water spreads into a pond. Beavers use the deeper pond as protection because it makes it harder for many land animals to reach the entrance of their lodge, or home.
- ② The pond changes the nearby habitat. Water-loving plants may grow along its edge, and insects can live among the new stems. Fish, frogs, ducks, and turtles may use the pond for food or shelter. These animals can attract predators, such as herons or otters. In this way, one beaver dam can affect many living things in an area.
- ③ People sometimes see dams as a problem. A dam can flood a road, a field, or land near homes. Instead of removing every dam, wildlife workers may place a pipe through one. The pipe lets some water flow downstream while keeping enough pond water for the beavers. This solution can reduce flooding and protect the habitat that the dam created.
