Peregrines Above the City

- ① High above a city street, a peregrine falcon may nest on a tall building. The flat ledges and open views can resemble the cliffs where peregrines traditionally nest. In spring, the female usually lays three or four eggs in a shallow scrape, a small hollow in gravel or other loose material. Both parents help keep the eggs warm, although the female often spends more time incubating them.
- ② After about a month, the eggs hatch. Peregrine chicks hatch with a soft white covering called down. At first, the adults bring food to the nest and tear it into small pieces. As the chicks grow, they develop feathers and strengthen their wings by flapping. Young falcons usually leave the nest area for their first flights when they are about six weeks old.
- ③ Peregrines are known for fast hunting dives, called stoops. A bird may fold its wings close to its body and dive toward prey in the air. Its streamlined body and powerful wings help it move quickly. City nest sites can also place peregrines near pigeons and other birds they eat. Because people protected nesting places and reduced use of certain harmful pesticides, peregrine populations have recovered in many areas.
