### Why Our Town Needs Wetlands

- ① Our town should protect the wetlands near the river. Wetlands are areas where water covers or soaks the soil for much of the year. They are not empty, useless land. During heavy rain, they can hold extra water like a sponge. This helps keep water from rushing quickly into streets, homes, and the nearby river.
- ② Protecting wetlands also supports local animals. Frogs lay eggs in shallow water, and young turtles find food among wetland plants. Birds such as herons hunt fish and insects there. When a wetland is filled to make a parking lot, these animals lose shelter, food, or places to raise their young. Saving wetlands keeps these habitats available.
- ③ Wetlands can improve water quality, too. As water moves slowly through wetland plants and soil, some dirt and pollutants are trapped before the water reaches a river or lake. Cleaner water benefits people who fish, swim, or get drinking water from nearby sources. For these reasons, town leaders should protect wetlands instead of building on them.
