The Lantern Path

- ① Long ago, in a mountain village, Nia carried a small lantern home after visiting her aunt. Rain began to fall, and the path grew dark. Nia saw an old man standing near a broken bridge.
- ② The man said, "I cannot cross safely." Nia wanted to hurry home, but she held the lantern over the bridge. Together, they found the loose boards and stepped around them. The man reached the other side.
- ③ At the village gate, the man thanked Nia. He gave her a smooth blue stone from his pocket. Nia smiled, but the stone was not why she helped. She was glad he was safe.
