The Lost Seed

- ① At sunrise, Lena hurries into the town garden carrying a small, cracked pot. [Stage direction: She kneels beside a dry sunflower and brushes soil from its leaves.] “The heat took all the water,” Lena says softly. Her neighbor Mr. Ibarra enters through the gate with a watering can. He points toward the dark clouds gathering above the hill.
- ② [Stage direction: A strong wind bends the sunflower's tall stem.] Lena grips the pot with both hands. “We can save it before the storm,” she says. Mr. Ibarra sets the watering can down and holds a garden cloth over the plant. Together, they pour water slowly around the roots. The first raindrops tap the cloth, and Lena smiles.
- ③ For the class video presentation, the opening image shows Lena kneeling near a drooping sunflower, with a cracked pot beside her. A narrator says, “The heat took all the water,” in a quiet voice. In the next shot, a fan makes the sunflower bend while Lena holds the pot. Sound effects of raindrops begin as both characters water the roots beneath a cloth.

#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	The opening image includes a cracked pot. Which detail from the drama does this image reflect?	It reflects the detail that Lena hurries into the garden carrying a small, cracked pot.
2	How does the narrator's line in the video presentation match Lena's words in the drama?	The narrator says, "The heat took all the water," which is the same line Lena says in the drama.
3	In the video, a fan makes the sunflower bend. Which stage direction does this visual action reflect?	It reflects the stage direction, "A strong wind bends the sunflower's tall stem."
4	What two drama details are reflected when raindrop sounds begin and both characters water the roots beneath a cloth?	They reflect the first raindrops tapping the cloth and Lena and Mr. Ibarra pouring water around the roots while the cloth covers the plant.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

The video could show Mr. Ibarra entering through the garden gate with a watering can and pointing toward dark clouds above the hill. A narrator could say, "Mr. Ibarra arrives to help," while a low thunder sound begins.
