The Repaired Trellis

- ① On Friday afternoon, Lena hurried to the school garden for Saturday's seedling sale. She had spent two weeks painting signs and tying young tomato plants to a wooden trellis. Dark clouds rolled over the playground, and rain began to pound the garden. By the time the storm stopped, the trellis had fallen, several signs were muddy, and Lena's careful display looked ruined.
- ② Lena wanted to go home, but she remembered that the sale would pay for new library books. She carried the wet signs to the art room and wiped them clean. Then she asked Mr. Ortiz, the custodian, whether he had spare wood. He showed her how to brace the trellis. Lena called two classmates, who brought string and dry towels.
- ③ Early Saturday, the garden looked neat again. Lena placed a small card beside the repaired trellis that said, "Built together after the storm." Customers noticed the card and asked about the garden club. By noon, every tomato plant was sold. Lena smiled, not because her display had been perfect, but because people had worked together to save it.

#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	What challenge does Lena face after the storm?	The storm knocks down the trellis, makes the signs muddy, and ruins Lena's display.
2	How does Lena respond to the challenge before her classmates arrive? Use two details from the story.	She takes the wet signs to the art room and cleans them. She also asks Mr. Ortiz for spare wood, and he shows her how to brace the trellis.
3	What is one theme of the story? Support your answer with two details.	One theme is that working together can help people overcome problems. Lena asks Mr. Ortiz and her classmates for help, and together they repair the display so the sale can succeed.
4	Write a two-sentence summary of the story.	A storm damages Lena's garden sale display, including its trellis and signs. Lena cleans the signs, gets help repairing the trellis, and sells all the tomato plants with her classmates.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Just before the sale, wind blew the price list into a puddle. Lena asked a customer to hold the plants while she and her classmates made a new list on dry cardboard. The theme is that people can solve setbacks by working together.
