The Festival Shelter

- ① On the morning of the town's lantern festival, Maya carried a box of paper lanterns to the park. Dark clouds gathered above the river, and the wind tugged at the box lid. By noon, rain drummed on the picnic tables. The festival committee hurried beneath the pavilion, while Maya watched the empty path, a gray ribbon leading into the mist.
- ② Then Mr. Chen, the park gardener, pointed to a shed near the playground. Its roof is sturdy, he said. Inside, Maya found strings, tape, and a small battery lamp. An idea sparked in her mind. She asked the committee to hang lanterns along the shed walls. Soon, the gloomy room became a pocket of sunrise, glowing with red, gold, and blue paper.
- ③ Families arrived wearing raincoats and carrying umbrellas. At first, Maya worried that the tiny shelter would feel crowded. Instead, neighbors squeezed together, traded stories, and shared warm cider. Laughter rose above the rain. Maya realized that the storm had not washed away the festival. It had pushed the town closer, like books pressed neatly onto one shelf.

2	What does “An idea sparked in her mind” mean in paragraph 2?	Maya suddenly thought of an idea.
3	In paragraph 2, what does “a pocket of sunrise” tell you about the shed after the lanterns were hung?	The shed became a small, bright, warm-looking place filled with lantern light.
4	What does the simile “like books pressed neatly onto one shelf” show about how the storm pushed the town closer?	It shows that the neighbors were gathered closely together and became more connected.

The phrase means the library was a quiet, peaceful place away from the noise. The detail that pages turned softly while the assembly roared in the gym helps show that it was calm.
