### Adventure Choices

- ① Story One, "The River Signal": Maya and her uncle paddled past cedar trees when a sudden rainstorm swelled the river. A snapped branch blocked their path, and their canoe tipped toward the rocks. Maya wanted to paddle away quickly. Then she saw two younger campers stranded on a muddy bank, waving a red jacket above their heads.
- ② Maya tied the canoe rope around a thick tree root while her uncle held the boat steady. Together, they tossed a spare paddle across the shallow water. The campers used it for balance and reached the canoe. Maya was still frightened, but she chose to help before continuing downstream. Afterward, the four paddled slowly to the ranger station.
- ③ Story Two, "The Canyon Map": Luis explored a desert canyon with his older cousin when wind blew their map into a narrow crack. Without the map, they could not find the trail before sunset. Luis wanted to squeeze into the crack alone. Instead, he and his cousin piled flat stones to make a safe step. Luis reached the map, and both hikers followed the marked trail home.

**PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)**

In “The River Signal,” the canoe rope and spare paddle help Maya rescue the campers safely. In “The Canyon Map,” flat stones help Luis reach the map without entering the crack alone. Both authors use useful objects to show that adventurers can solve dangerous problems by acting carefully with another person.

Accept equivalent theme statements about careful action, courage, safety, or cooperation when supported by details from both stories. For the open response, look for exactly three sentences, an object from each story, and a clear comparison.
