HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each listening text twice, pause for students to ask a question about it, then read each row question and all of its choices. Students show an answer by circling one choice that gives a key detail from what they heard.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • STORY ANSWERS

SAY “Listen to this story: Mia has a small drum; on Saturday, she takes it to the park; she taps the drum two times; her friend Leo claps along. What question do you have about the story? Now listen to each question and its choices, then circle your answer.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Who has a small drum? Is it Mia, Leo, or park? Circle the word that answers the question.	Mia
b	Where does Mia take her drum? Does she take it to school, park, or home? Circle the word that answers the question.	park
c	What does Leo do along with Mia's drum? Does he sing, clap, or run? Circle the word that answers the question.	claps

PART 2 • FACT ANSWERS

SAY “Listen to these facts about a monarch butterfly: it has four wings; it drinks nectar from flowers; it travels to warmer places when the weather gets cold. What question do you have about these facts? Now listen to each question and its choices, then circle your answer.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	How many wings does a monarch butterfly have? Does it have 2, 4, or 6 wings? Circle the number that answers the question.	4
b	What does a monarch butterfly drink? Does it drink nectar, water, or leaves? Circle the word that answers the question.	nectar
c	When the weather gets cold, does the butterfly travel to home, warm, or cold? Circle the word that answers the question.	warm

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Story Answers: Mia, park, claps. Fact Answers: 4, nectar, warm. Accept a clearly circled choice, and listen for students' oral questions about either text.
