YOUR JOB Underline the details Mina added to focus on tomatoes. Circle the two editing changes she made to make her writing correct.

Mina's Tomato Draft

- ① Mina wrote about her class garden. Her first draft said, “Our garden is nice. We do things there.” Ms. Lee asked Mina to pick one part of the garden and add details. Mina chose the red tomatoes.
- ② Mina revised her draft. She wrote, “Three red tomatoes hung on the vine. I used both hands to pick one smooth tomato.” These details help readers picture one garden job instead of every garden activity.
- ③ Next, Mina edited her work. She changed “i” to “I” and put a period after tomato. Then she read the sentences aloud with a partner. Her partner helped her notice that each sentence was clear.
