A Rain Garden for School

- ① Our school should build a small rain garden near the playground. A rain garden is a shallow area planted with flowers and grasses. It collects rainwater that runs off roofs and sidewalks. Instead of making puddles near the swings, the garden would let water soak slowly into the ground. This would keep part of the play area drier after storms.
- ② The garden would also give students a living place to study. In science, classes could watch insects visit blossoms and notice how roots hold soil in place. Students could measure rainfall with a simple gauge. Learning outside would help many children see ideas from books happening in real life, right in the schoolyard each day.
- ③ Finally, a rain garden could make the schoolyard more welcoming. Colorful native plants can provide food and shelter for pollinators, such as bees and butterflies. Families and classes could help plant, weed, and care for the space. Building a rain garden would solve a water problem while creating a useful, beautiful place for everyone to enjoy.
