A Garden for Our School

- ① Our school should build a small vegetable garden near the playground. A garden would give students a place to learn about plants by caring for them. We could watch seeds sprout, measure growing stems, and notice which insects visit flowers. Reading about plants is useful, but working in a garden would make science lessons feel real.
- ② A garden could also help our school community. Families might donate seeds or tools, and classes could share the jobs. One class could water the plants, while another class could pull weeds. When vegetables are ready, students could taste them during a lesson or bring some home. These shared tasks would teach responsibility and cooperation.
- ③ For these reasons, a school garden would be a smart addition to our playground. It would turn a sunny space into an outdoor classroom, bring people together, and help students practice caring for living things. Building the garden would take planning, but students and families could help. Our school should make room for a garden this year.
