- ② Lena fetched a trowel and loosened the soil. She mixed in dark compost from the garden bin, then made a hole wide enough for the roots. After placing the sunflower in the hole, she pressed the soil gently around its stem. Lena gave it a slow drink of water and tied a small label to a stick nearby.
- ③ Each week, Lena visited the garden before dinner. The sunflower grew taller than the fence rail, and its yellow face turned toward the morning light. When Lena saw bees resting on its petals, she smiled. Her careful work had changed one empty patch into a bright place for people and insects to enjoy.
