Compost Bins at School

- ① Our school should place compost bins near the cafeteria. Each day, students toss banana peels, apple cores, and other food scraps into trash cans. Those scraps can break down into rich soil instead. A compost bin would give leftover food a useful job. It would also help students see that small choices can reduce the amount of trash our school sends away.
- ② Compost can improve soil used in gardens. When food scraps are mixed with dry leaves and kept damp, tiny living things help change them over time. The finished compost can be added to garden beds, where it helps soil hold water and nutrients. Our science club could use compost from the cafeteria in the vegetable garden beside the playground.
- ③ Adding compost bins is a practical step our school can take now. The bins would keep useful scraps out of the trash, provide material for our garden, and connect lunch choices to science learning. For these reasons, compost bins belong near our cafeteria. By starting with food scraps from lunch, we can turn everyday waste into something that helps our school garden grow.
