How Beaver Dams Matter

- ① Beaver dams change streams and help beavers make safer homes. These busy mammals build dams from branches, mud, and stones. A dam slows moving water and creates a pond behind it. Beavers use the pond to swim, find food, and reach a lodge with an underwater entrance. This entrance helps keep the animals safer from many land predators.
- ② Beaver dams also change the land around a stream. Because water moves more slowly, soil often stays in the pond instead of washing downstream. Over time, this soil can make the pond shallower and create wet, muddy edges. These wetlands may provide homes for frogs, fish, birds, and insects. In this way, one beaver dam can affect many living things in and near the water.
- ③ Beaver dams can also affect people and offer clues about how water shapes land. However, a dam may flood trails, roads, or fields when it raises the water level. People sometimes protect these places with devices that let some water flow through a dam. Overall, beavers are small animals with a large effect on their environment and nearby habitats.
