From Seed to Plant

- ① After a bean seed is planted, it absorbs water through its seed coat. The water causes the embryo inside to swell. Soon, the seed coat splits, and a tiny root, called a radicle, pushes into the soil. The radicle anchors the young plant and takes in water and minerals. This first stage is called germination.
- ② Next, a shoot grows upward and breaks through the soil surface. The shoot carries two seed leaves, or cotyledons. At first, cotyledons provide stored food for the seedling. As green leaves unfold, chlorophyll captures light energy. During photosynthesis, the leaves use light, water, and carbon dioxide to make sugar, which supplies energy for the growing plant.
- ③ Over time, the seedling develops a stem and more leaves. Its roots branch through the soil, forming root hairs that absorb water and dissolved minerals. The stem transports water from the roots to the leaves. With enough sunlight, water, air, and space, the seedling can grow into a mature bean plant. Later, the plant may produce flowers and seed pods.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

First, water enters the seed coat and starts germination. Next, the radicle grows into the soil while cotyledons feed the seedling. Later, chlorophyll helps the leaves make sugar during photosynthesis, and the mature plant can form seed pods.
