Trees in the Neighborhood

- ① Trees in a neighborhood do more than make streets look green. Their leaves catch some sunlight and use it to make food. On hot days, tree shade can keep sidewalks, playgrounds, and nearby buildings cooler. Trees also release water vapor from their leaves, which can help cool the air around them. These effects are easiest to notice during warm weather.
- ② Tree roots also help manage rainwater. When rain falls, soil around roots can soak up some water instead of letting it rush across pavement. This can reduce runoff, the water that flows over land and may carry soil or trash into storm drains. Roots hold soil in place, too. A healthy tree needs enough room for its roots to spread underground.
- ③ Neighborhood trees need care, including water when they are newly planted and protection from damage. People can also choose suitable tree types for the available space. By cooling places, helping rainwater soak into soil, and holding soil steady, trees make neighborhoods more comfortable and healthier. For these reasons, planting and caring for trees is a useful way to improve a community.
