Maya's Boat Test

- ① On Tuesday, Maya carried her cardboard boat to the school pond for the science test. She had spent two afternoons folding the sides and covering the seams with wax. When her group set the boat on the water, it floated for only a moment. Then one corner bent, and water slipped inside. Maya felt her cheeks grow warm as the boat tipped over.
- ② Mr. Ellis asked the group to name one change before trying again. Maya noticed that the wet corner had no support underneath it. She cut a small triangle from a cereal box and taped it inside the boat. Her partner added a strip of wax paper over the tape. At the second test, the boat stayed level while they counted to thirty.
- ③ Maya smiled, not because the boat was perfect, but because her group had used the first test to solve a problem. They wrote that the support and wax paper helped keep water out. As they carried the boat back to class, Maya knew that a failed try could lead to a better plan when she paid attention and made a change.
