### Maya's Sea Otter Report

- ① When Maya prepared a report about sea otters, she did not copy every fact she found. She chose facts that answered her questions: Where do sea otters live? What do they eat? How do they stay warm? In the library book *Sea Otters* by Laura Marsh, she learned that sea otters live along the North Pacific coast. She wrote that fact on a note card labeled Habitat.
- ② At the Monterey Bay Aquarium website, Maya found that sea otters eat animals such as clams, crabs, and sea urchins. She placed this information under Food. A second website, from NOAA Fisheries, explained that sea otters have very thick fur. Air trapped in the fur helps keep them warm in cold water. Maya put this note under Body Features.
- ③ Before writing, Maya checked her cards. She kept notes about habitat, food, and body features because they fit her report questions. She left out a note about a zoo's opening hours because it did not help explain sea otters. At the bottom of her page, she listed her sources: *Sea Otters* by Laura Marsh, Monterey Bay Aquarium website, and NOAA Fisheries website.
